ESCs Are Public Education Agencies

ESCs, as Defined in Both State and Federal Law as School Districts, are Public Education Agencies

ESCs are grounded in state and federal law. ESCs are defined as school districts under section 3311.05 of the Ohio Revised Code and, in federal statute are defined in the Higher Education Act (HEA), Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), and Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) as such, "(A) -The term 'local educational agency' means a public board of education or other public authority legally constituted within a State for either administrative control or direction of, or to perform a service function for, public elementary schools or secondary schools in a city, county, township, school district, or other political subdivision of a State, or of or for a combination of school districts or counties that is recognized in a State as an administrative agency for its public elementary schools or secondary schools. (D) The term includes educational service agencies and consortia of those agencies."

The Educational Service Center of Central Ohio (the "Center") is a body politic and corporate established for the purpose of exercising the rights and privileges conveyed to it by the Constitution and laws of the State of Ohio. The Center is a public entity subject to inspection and audit under Uniform Guidance (2 CFR § 200), as well as subject to annual audits by the Ohio Auditor of State. Such audits include testing of Compliance and Internal Controls over the financial Statements as well as Federal, State and Local funds administered.

As a public Entity the Center has been subject to audits by various Federal and State Agencies as well as the Auditor of State of Ohio, as stated above. Any public agencies or its representative, that provides funds to or buys services from the Center, is able inspect the books, documents and records of the Center.

The Center follows appropriate guidance as it relates to Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) And the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) To Student Health Records, as well as having Board Policies in place governing such items.

The Center does not have any history of suspension or disbarment as it relates to administering Federal Funds.

Educational Service Centers in Ohio were created under State Statute, to provide Educational and Support Services needs to local school districts. The District through its Comprehensive Contract (Contract) with the Center, purchases services for Educational and Support needs from the Center. The contract is a legal binding document which gives both parties certain rights and responsibilities as it relates to services provided.
